Mathematics Enrichment Programs in Schools

Background

At a Heads of Faculty meeting (independent schools) early in 2002, the MAV Student Activities Committee requested interested teachers to come together in order to pool enrichment material and resources. This would be done with a view to publishing a list of available material.

During the discussions the focus shifted to looking at enrichment programs and their nature and purpose in different schools. It became apparent that there was a need to look more widely at enrichment programs rather than just collate materials.

Many teachers were interested to know what others were doing in terms of the structures they had in place and the level of commitment schools were prepared to offer. Whether acceleration in mathematics is the only way to go is also an issue that schools are grappling with.

The committee then shifted its focus to the production of a manual to assist teachers in structuring enrichment programs for more able students.

This was also seen as a way of helping schools, and school administrations, in particular, to understand the greater need to focus on enrichment in mathematics and perhaps less on acceleration.

Enrichment in mathematics is the responsibility of all classroom teachers and is not meant to be the sole property of the high achievers.

However, our work in producing this manual was specifically geared to offering support to schools that offer, or are looking for ways to offer, enrichment programs for their gifted and/or highly capable mathematicians. (Broader issues related to enhancing students' mathematical learning was not the focus of this group for the time being.)

We identified the following chapters:

- Resources
- Sample School Structures
- Student Identification
- Sample Programs
- Acceleration Programs:
 - History
 - Pros and cons
 - Anecdotal and statistical evidence

So with all this behind us, we called for interested parties to be involved in the production of one or more of these chapters. Our first meeting began with an attempt to define enrichment. This was quite a debate. In the end we settled on the following definition:

The underlining purpose and nature of an enrichment program is to recognise, nurture, motivate and consolidate mathematical talent; particularly the talent that relates to creativity and higher order thinking skills.

In an environment which provides opportunities without restrictions, for students to construct mathematical concepts for themselves, such a program is delivered with a view to further enhancing student understanding of the application and use of mathematics in everyday life.

There have been many terms used to describe such programs, with acceleration, enrichment, enhancement and extension being the main ones. For the purpose of this document, we have chosen to make the following distinctions.

Acceleration is defined as a program that delivers content at a level above the standard of any given year. For example, a Yr 6 student working at CSF Level 5 in Number.

Extension is defined as the completion of additional, more challenging problems that seek application of the facts and skills content from a given topic in a manner that requires greater use of higher order thinking skills. They may also be challenging problems that fuse related skills from other standard topics, areas of study or in fact other subject areas.

Enhancement is defined as a program that delivers mathematical skills and techniques that are not part of a typical mathematics course of study. This would include problem solving tasks that explore new, different and perhaps more complex mathematical concepts. This is often referred to as lateral extension work and is targeted at those students that have advanced higher order thinking skills for their age.

An **Enrichment Program** is defined as one that delivers aspects of acceleration, extension and enhancement and is designed to enable students to maximise their learning potential.

Where to from here?

The committee has set up working groups for each chapter. Most groups are looking to survey schools to gather data about the programs they currently offer. What you'll find below is a list of contacts for each working party.

The MAV encourages as many schools as possible to participate in the completion of various surveys. We are aware that this can be a daunting task and so each group has kept their survey simple.

On the other hand, you may choose only to participate in a survey that is of particular interest to your school. Those who choose to participate in a survey will be the first to receive the results. 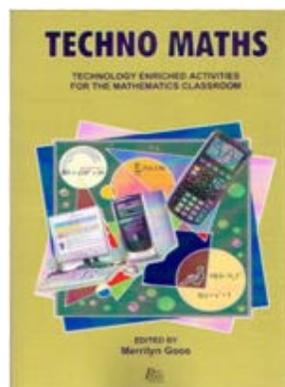

Problem of the Month

ADD & MULTIPLY

Goal:

To find the highest value by adding pairs of dice and then multiplying.

Materials:

Four dice.

Players:

Two players or two groups of two players.

How:

The four dice are rolled and the players race to produce the largest value (if 2, 3, 4 and 6 are rolled, they could be paired in the following ways:

- $2 + 3 = 5$ & $4 + 6 = 10$ so $5 \times 10 = 50$
- $2 + 4 = 6$ & $3 + 6 = 9$ so $6 \times 9 = 54$
- $2 + 6 = 8$ & $3 + 4 = 7$ so $8 \times 7 = 56$

The player/s with the highest value score one point. Play for a set number of turns or to reach a specific total value target.

Variations:

Find the smallest total.

Add three numbers and multiply by the fourth.
Use different types of dice (4, 10 or 12 sided)

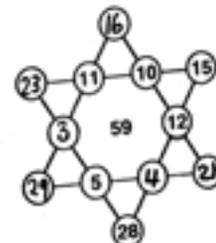
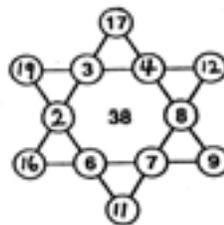
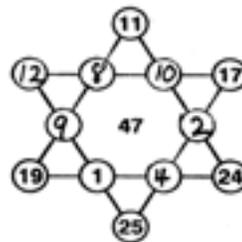

Book Review

TECHNO MATHS – TECHNOLOGY ENRICHED ACTIVITIES FOR THE MATHS CLASSROOM

Edited Merrilyn Goos, 2002, Post Pressed Qld, , 98 pages, \$41.50

How good was Bob Beamon?

In 1968 Bob Beamon smashed the world long jump record by 65cm, setting a mark that stood for an unparalleled thirty-three years.

Hence a mathematical investigation: by considering the world records over the century, students find how far ahead of his time Bob Beamon was – an astonishing 48 years!

TECHNO MATHS has thirteen investigations, which use technology as a main tool to develop mathematical concepts and investigate problems.

In this task, students use a spreadsheet or Graphics Calculator to fit a line to world record data and investigate how far off this line Beamon really was. It was a simple, yet very rich task most students thoroughly enjoyed.

This recent Queensland publication contains activities compiled and used by pre-service teachers. All use technology as a tool to investigate interesting problems, and come with comprehensive solutions, teaching notes, and mapping to curriculum frameworks.

For your money you get a booklet with thirteen well-developed investigations. You also get a CD containing an electronic version of the book plus a spreadsheet activity on queuing theory.

If you're looking for a resource to help you use technology in the classroom, this is terrific. However, I found it important to work through the activities first before trying them in the classroom.

Here's one more task to think about. The Love Bug.

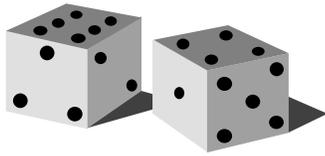
'The recent havoc wreaked in cyber-world by the infamous 'Love Bug' virus has served as the inspiration for this technology-based activity. It involves a simulation of students sending email messages, in order to investigate the spread of computer viruses...'¹

The use of acids and bases to model this problem physically, combined with the use of Graphics Calculators to fit functions to the resultant data, is a fascinating and powerful way of modelling exponential functions and looking at the spread of AIDS, computer viruses, or other diseases.

I look forward to using TECHNO MATHS in my class regularly to add interest, better use technology, and help connect mathematical concepts with the real world.
